SAVE BROAD RIVER

A massive industrial project is moving forward in Franklin Springs—without public input or transparency. Plans include a Pilgrim's Pride chicken rendering plant, dozens of acres of waste storage ponds, and a 4-million-gallon-per-day wastewater treatment facility, all of which threaten to release harmful air pollution and wastewater into the surrounding environment.

This development was planned behind closed doors by a handful of local officials, using deceptive tactics to bypass public oversight. If built, this facility will permanently impact:

- Our communities' homes, health & water supply
- Everyone downstream—7 counties impacted: Stephens, Franklin, Madison, Elbert, Oglethorpe, Wilkes, and Lincoln
- And the Broad River ecology—one of Georgia's cleanest rivers
